A huge thank you to all of the parents who are following the rules, routines and restrictions regarding pick up and drop off.

Tameside numbers are increasing and I am part of a local committee looking at ways we can protect our community. I am aware that there are things occurring in the local community that seem to be against Government guidance, especially as Tameside is in local lockdown restrictions. The restrictions are difficult but are there to protect everyone within the community.

As a result, local councillors have asked Public Health to visit schools and monitor how we are working and look at social distancing. When on the school premises we ask that you adhere to your household bubbles, 2m distancing between families and queue like all the families. I know it is time consuming and I know it can be frustrating but it is vital for the safety of all the additional adults and children who are on site.

You may also be aware that schools in the locality have had to close bubbles. This is unavoidable once a case has been confirmed, but by working together and following the lockdown guidance, we will be more able to try to keep everyone safe and hopefully school open.

A special thank you to all of those families who have taken the time to contact the school to show your support of the decisions and processes in place. This support really lifts the wellbeing of the staff and myself during these extremely challenging times.
