Prime area: Personal, Social, Health and Emotional Children will learn:

- to recognize their talents and 'celebrating' differences
- to build their confidence and self esteem through our Christmas performance

Prime area: Communication and Language Children will be:

- learning to listen in a range of situations
- following instructions with a two part sequence
- learn to work and discuss as part of a small group
- using language to recreate roles and put on a play for parents
- imagining and recreating roles real life situations and in fictional settings
- learning to retell the Nativity story

Prime area: Physical Development

Children will learn to:

- travel with confidence and in a range of different ways
- move and respond to music
- form some recognisable letters
- use a range of outdoor tools such as spades and rakes

Specific area: Understanding the World

Children will be:

- investigating light and dark
- discovering nocturnal and diurnal animals
- looking at space, space exploration and the planets
- exploring and recording the seasonal changes in Autumn
- going on walks around the school to observe seasonal
- changes and the local environment, flora and fauna
