



# **DISCOVERY ACADEMY NEWS**

## UPDATE ON CAR PARK AND DRIVING

Following on from recent communications regarding driving and parking on the school site, I am now writing to inform you that the Trust have decided that there needs to be some changes to the access of Discovery Academy. This decision has been taken in line with other school sites locally and also across Victorious Academies Trust. The amount of anti-social behaviour and admin time taken to deal with complaints and people not following the road rules has meant that the current system is no longer viable.

From Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February the staff carpark, parking bays on the incline and the pedestrian crossing will now be closed to **ALL** vehicle users between **8:30am and 8:50am** and again between **3:00pm and 3:30pm** Monday to Friday. This is to ensure the Health and Safety of the children using the pathways and crossing the road.

There will be a temporary road block in place from Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February whilst we investigate and source a more permanent fixture. The staff on duty during the temporary block will be directed to not allow any cars through during these times.

During the hours of 7:00am – 8:30am the road will be open but any cars which have not left the area by 8:30am will need to wait until 8:50 before being able to exit. This will allow disabled users the opportunity to arrive in good time and use the bays if required. The roundabout will have clear signage to say that there is no waiting on the roundabout. Only blue badge holders can park in disabled bays and must display their pass.

As a result, this means that there will be no disabled parking access during the road blockage. No cars will be given access to come past the barriers at this time even if they have been given a Discovery Access pass or have a blue badge. **As of Friday 9<sup>th</sup> February, 3:45pm, all passes will be void.** 

All of the schools across Victorious Academies Trust close their whole car parks during the start and end of the school day. Should this not encourage better driving, people planning their journey better and reduce anti-social behaviour we have on the car park, then we will have no choice but to close the whole school site at 8:30 am.


