SAFEGUARDING

I have been made aware of an app and a WhatsApp chat which demonstrate a considerable risk to young children:

'Cam go.' 'Cam go' does not require a sign up and it can be accessed from Google. It is an app that puts you in touch with strangers. As well as sharing video and photographs, there is a chat facility. This is also known as 'Chantingly.' There have been reports of online grooming on this app in the Greater Manchester Area.

The 800 Club. This is a WhatsApp group. The aim of this chat is to reach 800 members. It currently stands at around 600. Within this group unknown members have shared far right imagery, nude imagery in the form of gifs, inappropriate and offensive language and children are being asked to divulge personal details, such as their age.


Children In Need
