

Tameside Local Authority SEND inspection

Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) are visiting Tameside as part of the Local Area special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) Inspection. They will look at the Local Authority's arrangements for children and young people with SEND across the local area partnership which is education, health and social care.







