
VE DAY






EYFS WEEK IN PICTURES




The children in Nursery became Superheroes and used positional language as they moved across the climbing frame.

In PE this week, we have been learning to stretch and roll in gymnastics. It was good fun creating some of our own moves






LKS2 WEEK IN PICTURES




We have also celebrated VE Day and learnt about the many reasons why people in Europe honour this day.

After School Club phone


